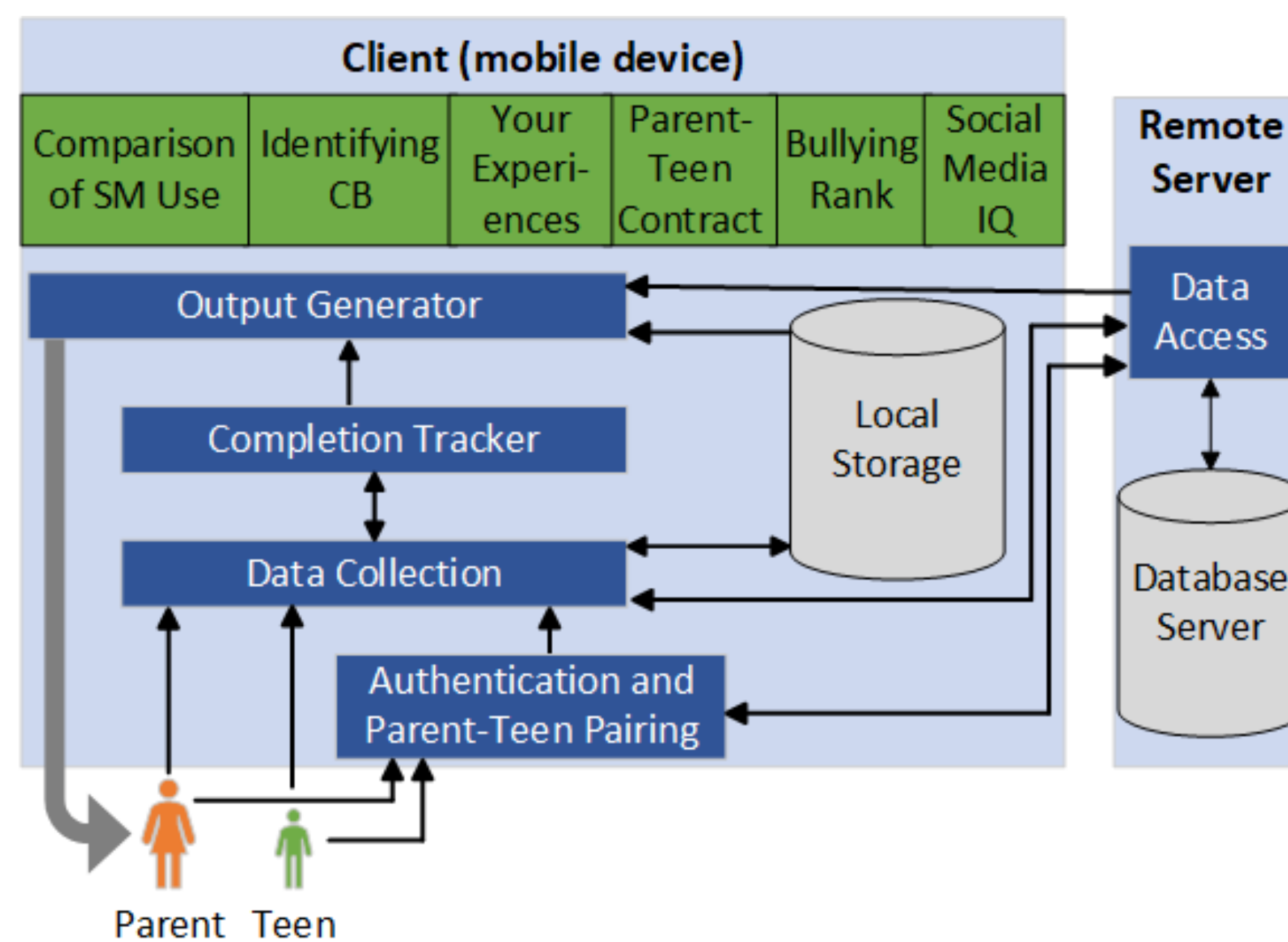


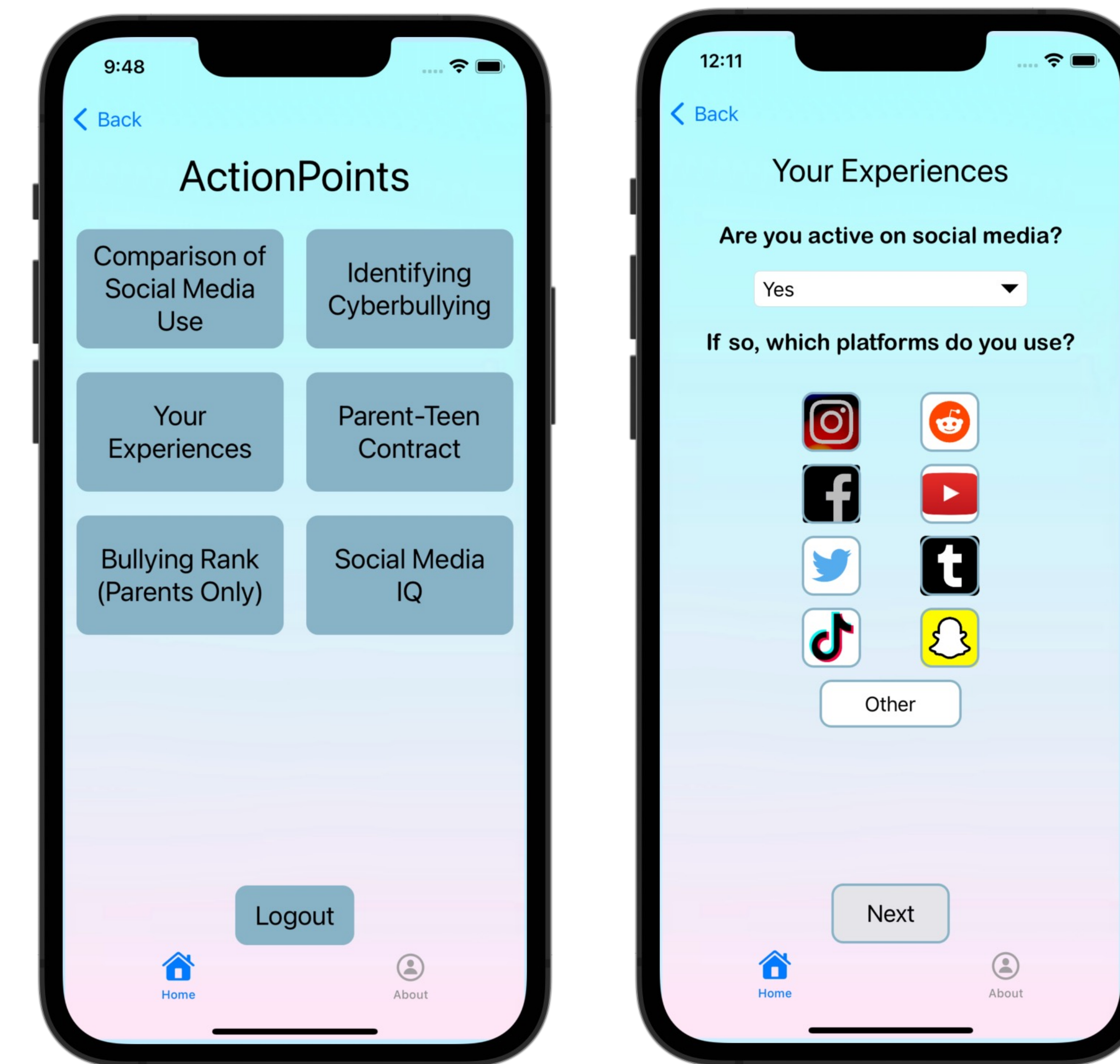
Overview

Design & Architecture

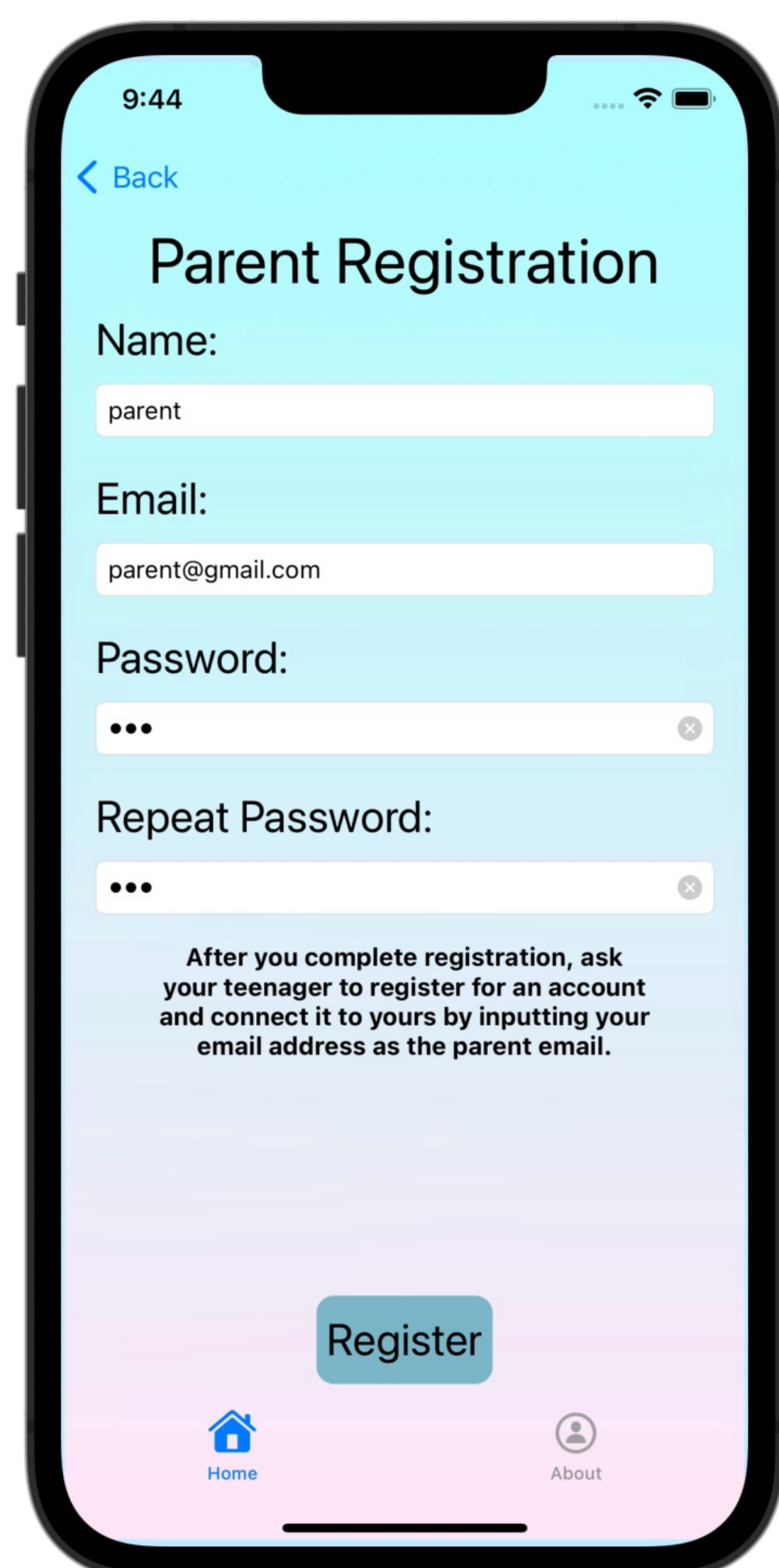


- Survey-based response system
- Developed for iOS compatibility and colorblind-friendly features
- Generates comparison of answers
- Allows one-to-one engagement with parents and teens

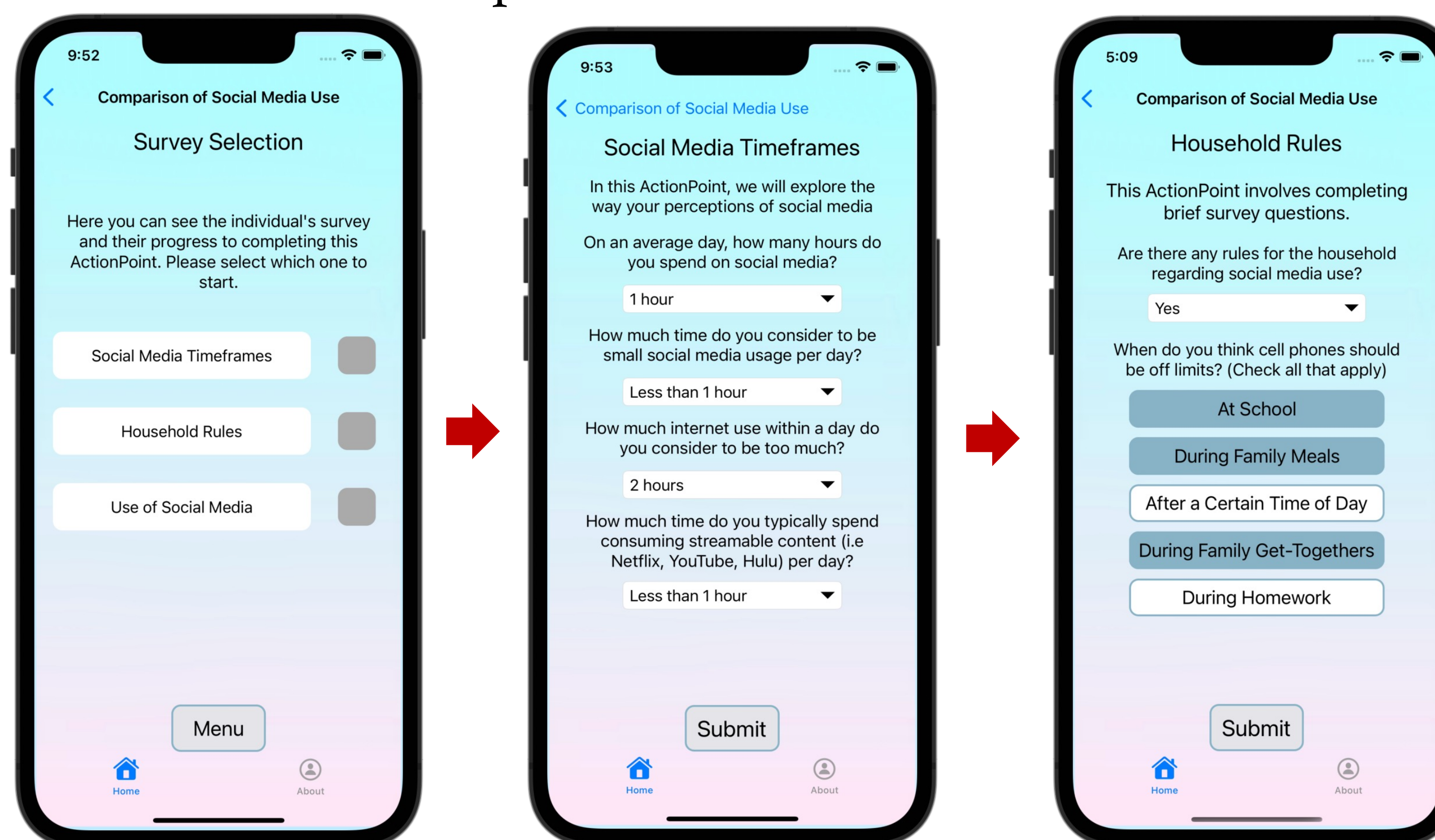


Framework

- Parent-Teen contract.

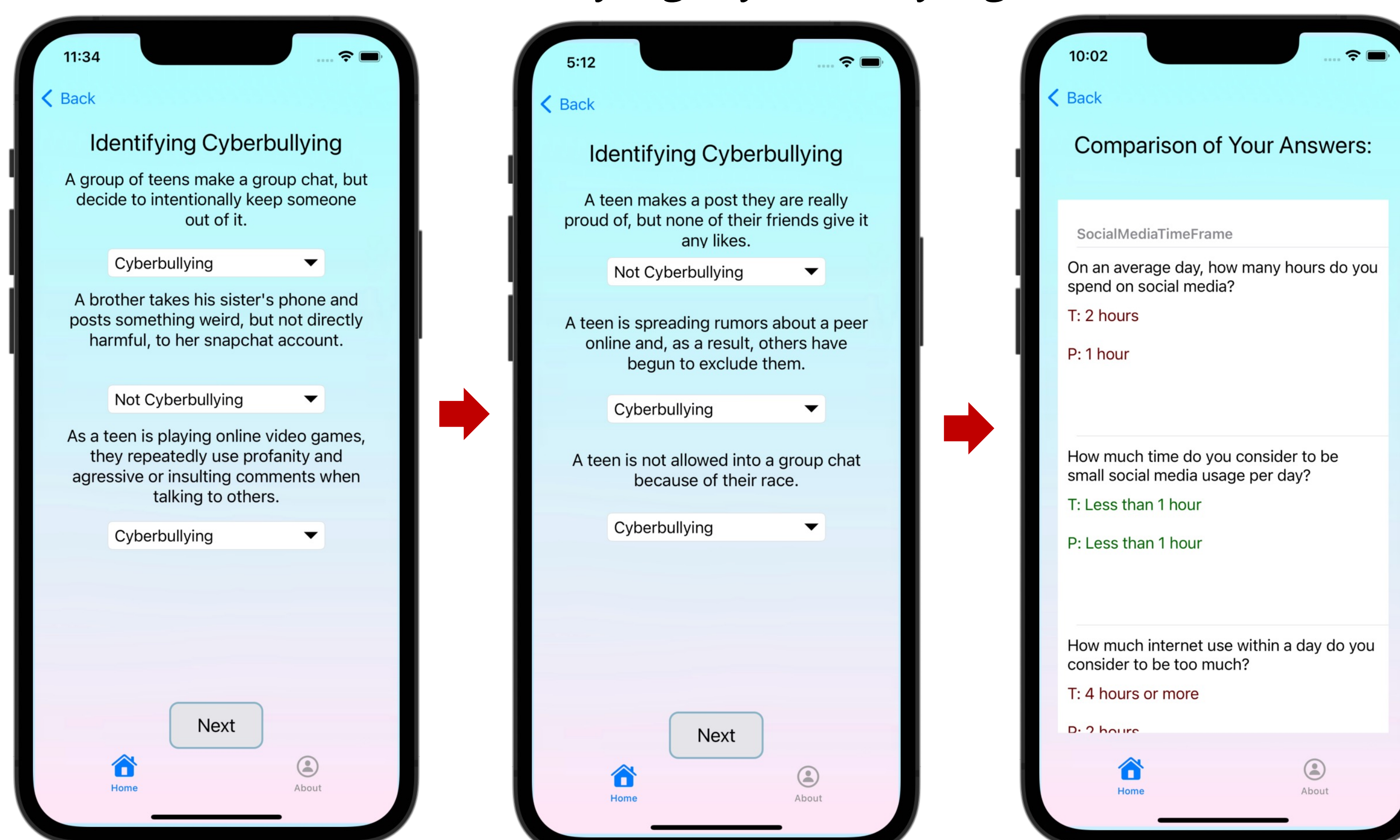


Comparison of Social Media Use



Helps parents and teens compare their understanding of household rules with technology and social media use.

Identifying Cyberbullying



Measures parents' and teens' ability to identify cyberbullying instances in a variety of scenarios.

Research shows that open conversations about the teen's technology use and jointly established family rules were linked with a decrease in cyberbullying [3]. Parents and teens do this in 3 surveys:

- Social Media Timeframes
- Household Rules
- Social Media Use

- Research suggests that educational and intervention efforts can improve ability to recognize cyberbullying [2].
- Designed to gain greater awareness of many forms cyberbullying can take
